

Fisher Grads Hear Bishop

Bishop Hogan urged 300 graduates of St. John Fisher College at last Sunday's commencement "to be humble enough to admit the need for the creative spirit of God in our world and you will renew the face of the earth."

The Bishop, principal speaker at the 16th annual commencement of the college, was given an honorary doctor of laws degree, being cited as "a craftsman of freedom" and praised for his leadership in the establishment of a program of studies at the college for prospective priests.

Decrying "the huge gap that is developing between our scientific knowledge and our moral evaluations," the Bishop recommended that the graduates adopt the virtues of self-denial and mortification as an aid in establishing a desire "to be skilled in the art of living with others and of loving others."

The world, he declared, "has never been renewed by the cynic and the hypercritical, but rather by the lover and the enthusiast."

He maintained that "the polarization that has taken place in our society is more frightening than any foreign war, or any condition of politics or economics."

A valuable part of the education of the class of 1970, Bishop Hogan contended, "has derived from the fact of deep involvement in the mainstream of the great contemporary moral, social and political problems." Today, he continued, "the challenge must be to continue the concern that already has been passionately begun . . . You need not await your turn at some remote date to exercise it."
