

We're Insane, Plead Chicago Defendants

Chicago — (NC) — A U.S. federal district court judge here ordered a priest and three other people to undergo psychiatric testing when a lawyer for the four alleged they were mentally ill at the time they reportedly destroyed Selective Service records here in May, 1969.

Judge Edwin A. Robson, ordered Father Nicholas J. Riddell, OCD, of Milwaukee and three codefendants — William Durkin, 20 and Edward Gargan, 19, of Milwaukee and Linda Quint, 23, of Chicago—to be examined by a psychiatrist at Elgin State Hospital after attorney Frank W. Oliver entered a plea of insanity in their behalf.

According to Oliver, the four are suffering from delusions that the war in Vietnam is immoral. Father Riddell, testifying as a lay expert because of his counseling experience, supported his codefendants' insanity pleas.

Reporting to the court on a sensitivity session held the day before the draft board raid, Father Riddell testified that all of the defendants seemd to be insane. He based his opinion on what he called Miss Quint's deviant thoughts that the United States was an essentially racist country. He also reported that Miss Quint, Gargan and Durkin had unconventional hair styles and wore unconventional clothes.

The defense's insanity move got its impetus from Vice President Spiro T. Agnew's remark that dissidents were "criminally insane." Judge Robson rejected an effort to subpoena the vice president to serve as a defense witness on the grounds that Agnew is not qualified to testify on the criminally insane.

Oliver and Father William C. Cunningham, SJ, also a defense attorney, are trying to prove that the defendants are insane because of their anti-war political beliefs. They aim to put the prosecution in the role of proving the defendants are "normal."

Pope Stresses Indissolubility Of Marriage

Vatican City — (RNS) — Against the background of controversy concerning the bill to legalize divorce in Italy, Pope Paul VI re-affirmed the "eternal values" of the family "in which man and woman live indissolubly united."

In a message to the association of Italian Artisans on the occasion of its third "National Day," the Pope praised the group for bearing witness to the "eternal values" of the family in accord with the will of God.

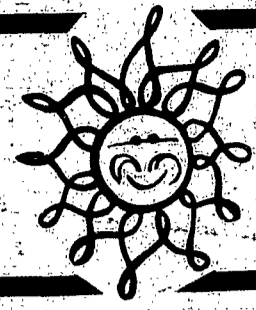
Observers feel that this latest papal defense of the family is linked with forthcoming talks between the Vatican and the coalition government of Premier Mariano Rumor on the controversial divorce bill.

The bill, which would legalize divorce in Italy for the first time, cleared the lower house last November. Premier Rumor's government is committed to holding consultations with the Vatican before the Senate takes up the bill in early June. The Vatican has said that the bill violates the 1929 Concordat which gives Roman Catholic marriage regulations the force of civil law in Italy.
