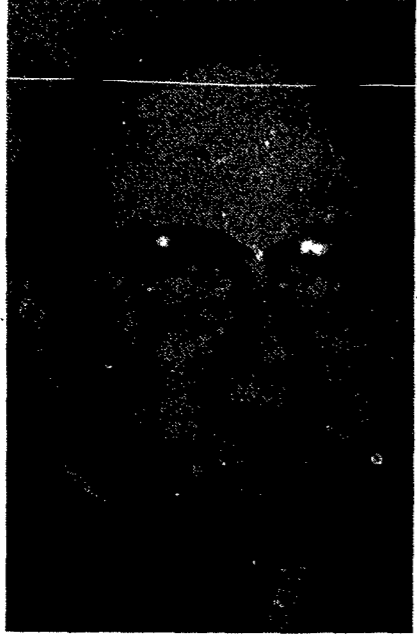


Five Pastors Retire

Retirement of five diocesan pastors was announced this week by the Pastoral Office. Named pastors emeritus are:

Msgr. Edward K. Ball, St. Francis de Sales, Geneva; Father William J. Devereaux, St. Columba's, Caledonia; Father Henry C. Manley, St. Patrick's, Aurora; Father William J. Riefer, St. Francis, Phelps; Father Ladislaus J. Szczepanski, St. Casimir's, Elmira.



MSGR. EDWARD BALL

Monsignor Ball, born in Rochester, attended St. Monica's School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained June 11, 1921, in St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Joseph H. Conroy of Ogdensburg.

After seven years on the faculty of Rochester Cathedral High School, Geneva, a post he Aquinas Institute, Father Ball was named principal of DeSales High School, Geneva, a post he held for 11 years. He was appointed pastor of St. Theresa's Church, Stanley, and its mission, St. Mary's, Rushville, in 1936, and in 1940 was named pastor of St. Patrick's, Dansville.

He was appointed pastor of St. Francis de Sales in Geneva on Feb. 27, 1945. Monsignor Ball's brother, Msgr. John M. Ball, is pastor emeritus of St. Rose Church, Lima.

Father Riefer, who has resigned for reasons of health, was born in Hornell. He attended St. Ann's School, Hornell High School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained June 5, 1943, in Sacred Heart Cathedral by Bishop James E. Kearney.

After serving as assistant at St. Alphonsus, Auburn, for a year, he was appointed to the faculty of St. Andrew's Seminary, where he taught for two decades. He was named pastor of St. Theresa's, Stanley, and

its mission, St. Mary's, Rushville, in 1964, and was appointed pastor of St. Francis Church in Phelps on June 28, 1967.

Father Szczepanski, born in Antrim, Pa., attended St. Stanislaus School, Rochester, Rochester Cathedral High School, and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained June 6, 1925, in St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop

Philip McDevitt of Harrisburg.

Father Szczepanski has spent his entire priesthood at St. Casimir's in Elmira, as assistant until December, 1933, and as pastor since then.

Father Devereaux, born in Rochester, attended Blessed Sacrament School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained June 7, 1924, in St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Daniel J. Curley of Syracuse.

(Continued from Page 13A) mation-character training" and "discipline" drew another 14 percent.

The gradual disappearance of many teaching Sisters from parochial school rooms was cited as the "most important objection" to the Catholic schools in 21% of the households. In addition some 14 percent objected to the cost of parish schools (tuition, books, fees) and 18% raised a question about teacher-qualifications.

He was ordained June 7, 1924, in St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Daniel J. Curley of Syracuse. He obtained a master's degree in the classics at Cornell University in 1932.

He served as assistant at Immaculate Conception, Ithaca; St. Mary's, Waterloo, and St. Mary's, Rochester, before being appointed in 1932 to the faculty of St. Andrew's Seminary.

In 1938 he was appointed pastor of St. Mary's, Bath, and in 1939 as pastor of St. Patrick's, Aurora, and its mission, St. Michael's, Union Springs. He also has served for many years as chaplain of the Campus Ministry Apostolate at Wells College in Aurora.

structure of the school system, despite the times or the finances, was very clear. Whenever the word close was used in questions about the future, responses ranged from 70% to 76% negative. There was equally strong protest against the proposal of putting up CCD centers adjacent to public schools.

Looking to the future 59% of the surveys showed that parishoners favored establishment of a diocesan-wide school board composed of representatives of laity, clergy and Sisters from various areas of the diocese.

For more than 20 years the Mother Cabrini Circle has been providing financial scholarships to Rochester area Catholic high schools for needy Negro boys and girls. Currently the Circle has contributed full or partial scholarships for 32 Negroes, for a total of \$5,600.
