### Bishop Issues Pulpit Ruling

Worcester, Mass. — (NC) — Pastors and their assistants have been advised by Worcester Bishop Bernard F. Flanagan that they must notify him before inviting "any one other than a priest or deacon" to preach in a church in the diocese.

Bishop Flanagan's letter did not mention whether he must approve of preachers who are not priests or deacons.

The bishop's letter stated that his directive was being issued "in accordance with a resolution taken at a recent meeting of the senate of priests."

Citing an incident in which parishioners walked out during an anti-war sermon delivered from the pulpit by two college students in a New Britain, Conn., church, the diocesan priests' senate asked at the meeting that Bishop Flanagan adopt a policy dealing with such situations "instead of waiting for a similar issue to arise in our diocese."
