British Nurses Balk At Abortion Law

London—(RNS)—An urgent review of the way Britain's liberal Abortion Act is working is being demanded here by the Royal College of Nursing, which represents some 67,000 full-time nurses and students throughout the country.

They made the demand in a letter to Sir Keith Joseph, secretary for social services in the new Conservative government, hard on the heels of an announcement that nurses at the state-run Stepping Hill Hospital at Stockport, northwest England, had imposed a ban on future abortion operations there.

The Royal College letter to Sir Keith said nurses are particularly worried about the number of beds occupied by abortion patients and the delay this could cause to those awaiting urgent treatment for serious gynecological conditions.

The letter, officially announced here, also spoke of the nurses "unhappiness" about the situation and warned Sir Keith that recent action by operating theater nurses at one hospital—Stepping Hill—was not an isolated instance.

The nurses at Stepping Hill are in revolt against the number of abortion cases and the distasteful task of disposing of the fetuses.

The Stockport nurses are also getting trade union support. Jack Lynch, general secretary of the 90,000-member Confederation of Health Service Employees, said here that if any hospital management committee started disciplinary proceedings against nurses for refusing to assist with abortions the union would be prepared to intervene.

Cardinal Cushing Urges Justice In N. Ireland

Boston — (RNS) — Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, made a strong plea here for the restoration of "full civil rights and social justice" for all citizens of Northern Ireland.

Cardinal Cushing, writing in The Pilot, archdiocesan newsweekly, stated:

"All of us have been listening with heavy hearts to the news that comes to us out of Northern Ireland. Every means must be encouraged to restore order to this troubled land, and to offer full civil rights and social justice to all of its citizens.

"The shifting elements of social change are at work in many parts of the world, and very often they bring with them the seeds of upheaval and violence. We know that the surest path to peace lies through justice, that men can be persuaded to work out their future in an orderly fashion when they are assured of a fair chance and the respect of their fellow men.

"Just as long, however, as they are deprived of their rights they will struggle for them; just as long as they see no promise of redress for themselves or their children they will be forced to acts of desperation. Northern Ireland's Catholic minority continues to ask only for justice, now too long and too cruelly denied them."


