

Denver Prelate Urges Vietnam Withdrawal

Denver — (RNS) — Roman Catholic Bishop James V. Casey has called on the U.S. to get out of Southeast Asia militarily and urged the government to reorient its priorities toward civilian rather than military problems.

In a statement drawn up at the request of the Archdiocesan Council of Priests, the archbishop also asked for a more liberal government policy toward persons objecting to specific wars rather than all wars.

His statement on Human Life and War follows by less than two months a statement on Human Life which dealt primarily with the problem of abortion.

In urging members of his archdiocese, which has a Catholic population of slightly more than 200,000 to consider the proposition that the U.S. withdraw troops from Southeast Asia, the archbishop also repudiated peace demonstrations which become violent.

He noted "it is irrational to seek the abolition of the violence of war by a violent protest."

Archbishop Casey also expressed gratitude "to the many of thousands of our youth who have sacrificed their lives in defense of our beloved country."

Abortionists 'Play God,' Rabbis Assert

New York — (RNS) — "Indiscriminate and blanket" abortions have been condemned by Orthodox Jewish leaders here.

Rabbi Joseph Karasick, president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, and Rabbi Bernard L. Berzon, president of the Rabbinical Council of America, said that to terminate a pregnancy for arbitrary reasons was "literally for man to play God and is religiously blasphemous and socially destructive."

No woman, according to a joint statement issued by the Orthodox Jewish leaders, is the "final arbiter about the disposition of her body and the embryonic human life flourishing therein. Doctors, too, must face up to the moral dilemma; whether they can play havoc with the basic worth and dignity of human life when they freely perform abortions."

"In Judaism," the statement added, "the life of an unborn child is sacred and only when it is a threat to the mother can the moral issue of abortion be resolved. For each person to decide arbitrarily on the basis of economics or convenience, whether a fetus is to survive is literally for man to play God and is religiously blasphemous and socially destructive."

Magazine Folds; Lacked Readers

Notre Dame, Ind. — (RNS) — A.D. 1970, the publication which was first issued last March as successor to the 105-year-old weekly, Ave Maria, has suspended publication for financial reasons.

Father John Reedy, CSC, publisher of Ave Maria Press, announced the new magazine's suspension after only 18 issues. The final number has been printed for the week of July 26.

Father Reedy said that the staff of A.D. 1970 was counting on a 60 per cent renewal from the subscribers to Ave Maria. Around the beginning of June, he said, this renewal figure dropped to 40 per cent, and parish sales diminished.
