

Churchman Blasts Arms Sale

London—(RNS)—The dean of St. Paul's Cathedral, in a sermon there, scored the new British government's decision to renew arms sales to South Africa.

Canon L.J. Collins said the South African government was a "Nazi regime" which is "racist and white supremacist." The clergyman is chairman of the Anti-Apartheid Defense and Aid Fund.

"Sir Alec Douglas-Home, when Foreign Secretary in a former Conservative administration, said that in his opinion racialism was the greatest threat to world peace," said Canon Collins. "Why, then has he made it his first concern as Foreign Secretary in the present Tory administration to supply arms to South Africa?"

He said it was a Christian concern that Britain's "self-interest" not be built at the expense of victims of apartheid.

Davao Made Metropolitan See

Vatican City—(RNS)—Pope Paul VI has raised the ecclesiastical status of Davao, in the Philippines, from diocese to archdiocese and Metropolitan See.

Bishop Clovis Thibault of Davao has been named archbishop. Bishop Antonio Mabutas of Laog, Philippines, has been appointed coadjutor, with the right of succession.

Prince Carlo Pacelli Dies

Rome—(NC)—Prince Carlo Pacelli, one of three nephews of Pope Paul XII, died in Rome Aug. 6 of a cardiac collapse. He was 87 years old.

Prince Carlo was born in Rome Sept. 29, 1903, the son of Marchese Francesco Pacelli, a lawyer for the Holy See with whom he worked for many years.

The prince began working as general counsellor under Pope Pius XI and held that title during the pontificates of Pope Pius XII, John XXIII and Pope Paul VI.

Court Upholds Chapel Rule

Washington — (NC) — U.S. District Court Judge Howard F. Corcoran has ruled that military authorities may order cadets and midshipmen at U.S. service academies to attend chapel services.

The judge commented that chapel services "are not aimed at the cultivation of religious faith or motivation but are aimed, rather, at the complete training of future officers who, in combat, will shoulder awesome responsibilities."

Cadets at the U.S. Air Force Academy, West Point and the Naval Academy had worked with the American Civil Liberties Union to seek a permanent injunction against mandatory chapel attendance. They argued that forced chapel attendance violated their freedom to worship without state interference.

'Human Life' Funds Assigned

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — The Human Life Foundation, which was founded in 1968 with an \$800,000 grant from the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, has disbursed its first research funds.

Three allotments totaling \$42,750 were assigned to Fairfield (Conn.) University, Marquette University and the National Commission on Human Life, Reproduction and Rhythm.

Black Catholics Set Convention

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — Auxiliary Bishop Harold Perry, S.V.D., of New Orleans will officiate at a Mass in the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception here to open the first National Conference of Black Lay Catholics.

The gathering, sponsored by the Black Lay Caucus of Washington, will be held at Catholic University Aug. 21 to 23.

Leading Negro students of the Catholic response to education, drug addiction, housing, black economic development, and black survival needs will discuss the theme, "The Black Catholic — The 70s — The Roman Catholic Church."
