

Rochester Rotary Hosts Hope Hikers

Some 72 local teenagers who "did their thing" for Project Hope were honored yesterday at a luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club.

Ellen Meerdink, a Rochester pediatric nurse who served aboard the S.S. Hope in Tunisia and Colombia, was the guest speaker at the luncheon in the Chamber of Commerce Building.

She spoke of what Project Hope has meant to both the sick and the medical profession in both Tunisia and Colombia.

The young people had organized and carried out a "Hike for Hope," a 25-mile walking tour of the city that garnered an unprecedented \$140,000 in donations. The donations were made by sponsors recruited individually by the 3,000 teenage hikers, and they were based on the number of miles each hiker covered.

Local Students In Advisory Group

Joseph Fichera, a junior at Aquinas, and Harvey Simon, Monroe High School senior, have been appointed to the state education department's new student advisory committee. The two recently were named advisers to the Rochester board of education.

The local students and 18 others from across the state will take part in a series of three-day meetings with Education Commissioner Ewald B. Nyquist and other state education department officials. Drug education, guidance programs, curriculum development and student government will be discussed at the meetings, the first of which is scheduled for September.

Chief beneficiary of the hike was Project Hope, a privately sponsored program of medical aid and education originally conceived to help the needy people of the underdeveloped nations. Recently it has extended its scope to include needy minority-group members in the United States.

Some of the money raised by the Rochester Hike went to three local activities, the Summer Youth Opportunities Program, Project Unique and the Western Monroe Community Project in Hilton.

At the luncheon, two high school students were singled out for their work as co-chairmen of the Hike project. Lee Caruana of East Rochester High School and Ralph Shields of Greece Olympia High School were presented with plaques by Raymond Hickok, charter member of the Rochester Hope board of directors.

Other plaques went to the Teen League of Rochester, Bishop Kearney High School, John Marshall High School and Mrs. Graham Weaver, an English teacher at Webster's R. L. Thomas High School. Mrs. Weaver, who trekked along with the teenagers, personally obtained 383 sponsors and walked the entire course to raise a total of \$1,263.75. She holds the individual record for number of sponsors and dollars earned in an American Hike for Hope.
