## 'Send A Mouse To College'

Do you know that some of your best friends are mice? "Send A Mouse To College" is one important phase of the year-round program conducted by the American Cancer Society, Monroe County Unit. During the month of August, WBBF Radio hopes to send 20,000 mice to the University of Rochester for cancer research.

The WBBF "Mousemobile" will be visiting all shopping plazas in the area as well as all branches of Marine Midland Trust Company of Rochester during the coming weeks. One mouse costs 27¢; and the "Mousemobile" hopes to reach a goal of \$5400, to purchase 20,000 mice, or a year's supply.

White mice—the Swiss-Webster strain—are used in college laboratories to help save lives from cancer. In Monroe County, where American Cancer Society research grants currently in progress total \$268,972, the University of Rochester Medical Center is a major consumer of Swiss-Webster mice.
