Local Girl Wins National Honors

The National Catholic School Press Association has recently awarded Lucille Gleichauf of 956 Avenue D first place for fiction in its 1970 writing, photography, and art contest. Lucille's story, entitled "The Judas Day," was published in the 1970 *Spectrum*, literary magazine of Nazareth Academy.

The setting for the short story is Germany of World War II. Lucille became acquainted with the locale and problems for her story during the summer of 1969. As a winner of a contest sponsored by the National Council of Teachers of German, Lucille spent four weeks on a cultural program in Germany.

Lucille is the first student at Nazareth Academy to earn credit for a creative writing course on an independent study basis. Her achievement in English further includes a 5 rating, the highest given, in an Advanced Placement course.

Another Nazareth Academy student, Andrea Virgilio, of Brockport, received an honorable mention in the same national contest for her interview entitled "College Chaplain: Friend, Counselor, Priest." Andrea's interview was with Father Michael Daly, chaplain at the State University College at Brockport.
