Picture Bit Brighter At Notre Dame High

Elmira — Although Notre Dame High School's proposed budget for 1970-71 reveals an estimated operating deficit of \$18,650, the school's financial picture appears brighter than it was a year ago.

Estimated expenditure for the next school year is \$220,700 while anticipated revenue is \$202,050. But in the 1969-70 school year the operating deficit was \$28,000, Principal Warren Tessier reported.

He said last year's deficit was overcome through a fund drive and special projects, such as the Boys Town Choir concert. Similar efforts will be required for the coming year.

The proposed budget is up about \$19,000 from last year's total of about \$201,433.44. Chief reasons for the increases are a new administrative post, instructional salaries and a hospitalization insurance plan for the Sisters.

Paul J. Manikowski was appointed last April to the newly-created post of dean of students.

On the revenue side of the budget, Notre Dame will receive state aid funds for the first time, under the special provision of a bill passed last spring by the state legislature. The aid will be based on average daily attendance, and Tessier estimates Notre Dame will get about \$26,000.

Tuition revenue also is expected to increase in 1970-71, because of an increase in enrollment of approximately 40 students.
