He followed the construction workers through the wilderness west of the Missouri to Promontory Point, Utah, where the Union Pacific linkup took place May 10, 1869. His photographs show the workmen and their primitive tools and methods; Indian fights and frontier settlements.

contemporaries in other parts of the country.

Opinions of youths between 16 and 21 were sought in the survey, which was conducted by Bisbing Business Research for The Milwaukee Journal.

Sixty three per cent of those responding said they agreed with the statement: "I believe in the concept of God as a Supreme Creator who rewards and punishes people in this life or in a heaven or hell."

Twenty per cent said they were uncertain and 13 per cent said they disagreed. The others gave no answer.

Eighty per cent said they considered themselves believers and 53 per cent said they attended church regularly although many did so because of parental pressure. Only 6 per cent said they never attend church.

Fifty-eight per cent said their feeling about organized religion was best described by the statement. "I believe in an organized church or religious organizations that preserve and perpetuate religion to serve God and mankind."

# HOPE IS MANY THINGS...

THE HOLY FATHER'S MISSION AID TO THE ORIENTAL CHURCH

Dear Friend:

There are a million-and-a-half refugees in the Holy Land, each one the voiceless victim of a war now in its 22nd year.

Mostly children, they are refugees torn to shreds by war.

We mend them best by giving them hope. Hope is a pair of shoes, an egg, a clean

blanket, a chance to receive the sacraments. Hope is a handful of practical action people—

priests, Sisters, and qualified volunteers-who leave their own homes and become refugees in the Holy Land for the refugees.

These people, just a handful, are our Pontifical Mission for Palestine.

They are people who feed, teach, heal, clothe, mend, fulfilling the love-mission of Jesus Christ, in Bethlehem, Nazareth, Cairo, Damascus, and war points in between.

Their mission is love, and peace with justice. Their strategy is service—the works of mercy, person-to-person, in the name of Jesus Christ.

There is hope in the heart of the blind child in the Gaza Strip because he is learning a trade in the Pontifical Mission Center for the Blind.

In Abu-Dis, outside Jerusalem, an elderly Muslim prays contentedly to Allah because Sister Patrick, from Ireland, is at his side.

Six Sisters from India - a physician, two nurses, three social workers-have arrived in war-torn Jordan, to work in the camps and live no better than the refugees.
