Rabbi Attacks Opposition To State Parochial Aid

New York — (RNS) — Supporters of state aid to church-related schools, including an Orthodox Rabbi, expressed confidence here that a federal court would uphold the constitutionality of New York's Mandated Services Law which was contested in a suit filed July 30.

Proponents of the law also attacked the "rigid" stand taken by the plaintiffs and charged them with a lack of awareness of "the changing climate in America."

Under the Mandated Services Act which went into effect July 1, New York State will provide \$28 million for record-keeping services required by law and performed by religious-related schools.

The suit against Gov. Rockefeller and other officials was filed by the Committee for Public Education and Religious Liberty (PEARL) and 11 individuals. PEARL is an organization of some 26 groups which has opposed all forms of state aid to church-related schools.

Following the suit by PEARL, Rabbi Morris Sherer, executive president of Agudath Israel of America, issued a statement which held that the 10 Jewish groups affiliated with PEARL are "die-hard opponents of Jewish all-day religious education."

Agudath Israel is a national Orthodox Jewish movement which has advocated government support of non-public schools for more than a decade.

"There can be no other explanation for Jewish organizations who obstinately refuse to place Jewish educational interests, the sole guarantor for

Jewish survival, above outworn and extreme application of the church-state separation dogma to the narrowest forms of government aid," Rabbi Sherer said.

His statement charged that "PEARL and its Jewish partners are not in tune with the changing climate in America, which now has recognized that the government does indeed have specific responsibilities to the non-public schools."

The Orthodox Jewish leader said he was confident the courts will uphold the constitutionality of the law "which these secularist groups are contesting."

Msgr. Eugene Malloy, chairman of the Committee of Non-Public School Officials in New York and secretary for education of the Diocese of Brooklyn, reported that his committee is also confident that the courts will rule in favor of the law.

The committee includes the secretaries of education and superintendents of schools for the New York and Brooklyn Catholic dioceses, officials of the Episcopal dioceses in New York and Long Island, a director of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of New York, officials of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and the Lutheran Church in America, directors of the National Society of Hebrew Day Schools and the Jewish Education Committee of New York, and a minister of the Ukrainian Church.

"From a practical point of view," Msgr. Malloy noted, "the problem for the state in view of the financial problems of non-public schools is whether they can provide some limited

assistance such as the Mandated Service Law provides — or whether the non-public schools will be forced to close, and the entire burden of educating 850,000 children transferred to the public sector."

He said the state legislature found what it thought was a constitutional method of providing limited assistance that would keep non-public schools open and save the state much larger sums of money.

"PEARL takes the very rigid, absolute position that if the government provides any assistance at all to parochial schools they are promoting religion," Msgr. Malloy pointed out.

He said groups now affiliated with PEARL contested the constitutionality of the state paying parochial schools for busing children in the 1940s, and for the use of textbooks in 1968. In both cases the private schools' position was upheld.

"They're going the same route with this bill and they're going to lose this also," he predicted.

Fire Ruins Batavia Church

Batavia — Wreckers were completing the razing of the old and recently abandoned St. Joseph's Church building here last week following a raging fire which swept through and gutted the building and its adjoining rectory.

The blaze, labeled of suspicious origin and the third to hit the church this year, broke out at 8 p.m. Aug. 18 in the 33-year-old three-story rectory while the pastor, Father Francis L. Schwartz, was visiting his mother at nearby St. Jerome's Hospital.

The rectory, recently replaced by a new one a few yards to the northeast, is only six feet west of St. Joseph's new

None of the three recent fires' causes have been explained, lending credence to church officials' theory that they had been set by arsonists. They announced that a reward would be offered for information leading to the arrest of a culprit.

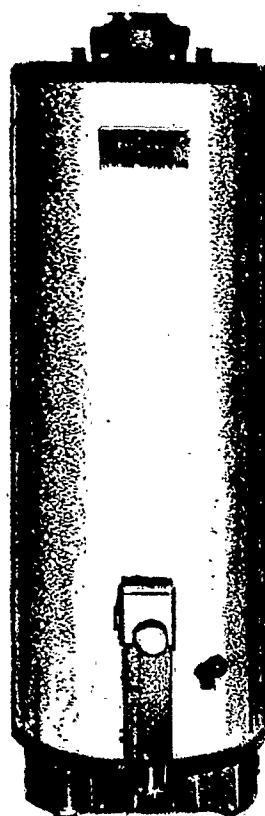
