Higher Enrollment **Expected at Auburn Parochial Schools**

Auburn-Enrollment is expected to be up at each of the six remaining parochial schools here, with two schools adding kindergartens.

Total enrollment, however, is not expected to reach last year's level because of the closing of the 130-pupil St. Aloysius school. Total registration in the parochial elementary schools was 1,974.

Schools adding kindertartens next month are St. Mary's and St. Alphonse.

Auburn will be without a Catholic secondary school for the first time in 40 years with the closing of 600-student Mt. Carmel High School last June because of an enrollment de-

The parochial schools reportedly have agreed to go along with a change in the school day and with the county school calendar, to facilitate busing provided by the Auburn public schools. The new school day will be from 9:05 a.m. to 3:20 p.m.

Four schools are coordinating registration and instruction in the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CDD) program for Catholic students enrolled in public schools. They are St. Hyacinth's, Holy Family, St. Alphonse and Sacred Heart.

Registration for the CCD

ther Bernard Carges will coordinate the elementary CCD program and teacher training for the entire county.

A teacher-training program is planned to begin Sept. 22, to run for six weeks. The first two sessions will be conducted by Father Albert Shamon and a group of diocesan officials.

Enrollment at St. Mary's School is expected to be approximately 305 pupils, up from the 275 figure of last June. Other projections:

St. Alphonsus, 610, up from June's 601; St. Hyacinth, 215, up from 197; SS. Peter & Paul, 130, from 102; Sacred Heart, 250, up about 30; Holy Family; 400, approximately the same.

Holy Family School will offer instruction in four foreign languages - Spanish, French, Italian and German — with pupils to be given an opportunity to study a language for eight years. Msgr. Joseph J. Sullivan, pastor, teaches Italian at the school.
