

Task Force, Chemung Unit, To Talk Schools

Diocesan school problems, particularly in the beginning those in Chemung County, will be met head on at a meeting next month between the recently-named diocesan Education Task Force and a coordinating committee on Catholic education being formed in the Southern Tier county.

Future Task Force meetings are scheduled in Auburn and Rochester.

It will be the function of the Task Force, according to Bishop Hogan, to study the current Catholic school situation in diocesan areas and to make recommendations.

The group, which has representation from throughout the diocese, includes four parish priests, a priest high school principal, six priests from the diocesan Department of Education, three Sisters and six laymen. It includes:
