



Named National Landmark

The designation of the Catholic cathedral of St. Augustine as a national landmark was disclosed in a letter from U.S. Secretary of the Interior Walter J. Hickel to Bishop Paul F. Tanner. The cathedral, which served as the parish church for what was the first permanent white settlement in the U.S. — founded in 1565 — was completed in 1797. It was designated a cathedral when the diocese of St. Augustine was created in 1870. (RNS)

Bishops Won't Budge In Rhodesian Dispute

Salisbury, Rhodesia—(NC)—The Catholic bishops and other Church leaders in Rhodesia are standing firm in their decision not to cooperate in what they feel is a racist policy of the government.

The bishops and leaders of other major Christian churches in this country have decided not to register as voluntary associations under the Land Tenure Act, which divides the country geographically between whites and blacks.

Under the act, white missionaries would not be allowed to work with Church schools and other institutions in the black areas without special government permission.

What action the bishops plan to take concerning Catholic schools, missions and other institutions depends very much on what the government will do to enforce the Land Tenure Act.

The Land Tenure Act, which came into effect in March of this year, gives the churches until Sept. 2 (today) to apply to the minister of lands for permission to use their land in a multiracial way.

The church can no longer use its own land or property freely. Legally, the minister of lands has the absolute power to permit or to refuse such occupation as may be "in his own opinion desirable," and there is no appeal beyond his decision.

If the head of any church concerned feels driven by his conscience to refuse to abide by the minister's arbitrary decision, the minister would be on unassailable grounds if he replied: "You applied for the permit, which necessarily implies your acceptance of my right to refuse it."

According to the bishops' new pamphlet, the Church cannot, therefore, apply for permits and take part in the creation of a situation in which its conscience may compel it to refuse to obey an authority it cannot recognize.

Zambian Lauds Pope's Role in Peace, Rights

Castelgandolfo, Italy — (NC) — Pope Paul VI is one of the "most influential" workers for world peace and an "ardent" defender of the rights of man, Zambia's new ambassador to the Holy See said here.

In presenting his credentials to the Pope Sept. 1, the new ambassador, Peter Wilfred Matoka, told him:

"My presence here is a reaffirmation of my country's ever-growing respect for you, not only as the visible head of the Catholic Church, but also as one of the most influential and widely respected campaigners for world peace and one of the most ardent protagonists of the rights of man."

The 40-year-old African diplomat, who had been high commissioner of Zambia in London before being sent to the Vatican, paid tribute also to the Pope's efforts to alleviate human sufferings.

"These sufferings and miseries still trouble the world," he said. "I am confident, however, that the Church under your guidance and great influence will continue to give leadership to the world in the endeavor to bring an end to those unhappy situations, where men, in the depths of frustrations, have taken up arms against each other."

Adult Education To Be Proposed

Washington — (NC) — The Presidential Commission on Pornography is reportedly considering recommending a federally financed sex education program for adults as well as children in this country.

The commission's formal report is still to be made but a "draft report" leaked here said such a "mass re-education" project could diminish interest in pornography and the "potential undesirable effects of exposure" to it.

The information regarding the commission's report indicates liberal views regarding pornography will be taken by the commission.
