The Will to Play

Willing to walk a couple of miles for a soccer practice? The boys from St. Patrick's Parish in Baltimore did—and, on their recent visit to Rochester, their eagerness to play soccer helped them defeat two local teams, before losing to a third.

The boys, ages 14-16, come from a disadvantaged neighborhood of mixed ethnic backgrounds in Baltimore. Much of their early practice was done in the streets. Nevertheless they swept through their opposition and won the city soccer championship of their age group in Baltimore.

Then they started to look around for other teams to challenge. With help from their leader Father Coyne and the Rochester City Recreation Bureau, they found some worthy opponents.

To get the cash to come to Rochester they collected and peddled newspapers. Then they piled into two station wagons and started out on the 300-plus-mile trek north.

The St. Pat's team played City Recreation Bureau leader Rob Scuteri's teams of the Junior Soccer League at Cobbs Hill, shutting out the Mustangs 3-0 and the Raiders, 4-1. However, they dropped their last game here to the Brockport Soccer Club at Edgerton Park, 2-1.

It is well to mention the soccer program at Cobbs Hill which made all this possible. Two leagues exist, namely the Juvenile League for ages 10-13 years, and the Junior League, for ages 14-16. Scuteri directs the former, while Jim Martin, a volunteer and a Kodak Distribution Center employee, directs the latter. After Scuteri had made the preliminary arrangements for the St. Pat's, Martin took over and arranged the remainder of the events.

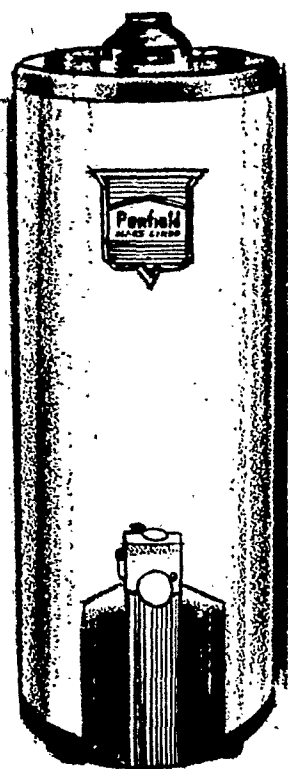
