## Ithaca Church Plans Special Fund Drive

Ithaca — Parishioners of Immaculate Conception Church will be asked during the next two weeks to consider an increase in their weekly parish support in order to meet rising costs and to reduce indebtedness.

Committeemen will visit half of the parishions on Sunday, Sept. 20, and the remaining half on Sunday, Sept. 27. The goal is to raise the weekly income from the present \$3,000 average to a minimum of \$4,500.

Father John S. Maloney, pastor, noted that "for the 1969-70 fiscal year ending June 30 our expenses exceeded ordinary income by \$35,000, and we anticipate increases in operation and maintenance costs in the current fiscal year."

He pointed out that the parish debt of \$338,477 has been "a real burden," requiring during the last three years interest payments amounting to \$61,314.
