Hornell — Twenty-four students of St. James Mercy Hospital who have reached the half-way point in the pursuit of a nursing career received the black velvet stripe last week at moving-up exercises held in DeSales Hall, the school's education building.

In the presence of family, faculty and guests, members of the class of 1972 were noted as having completed 656 hours of instruction in anatomy, physiology, chemistry, microbiology, nutrition, essentials of nursing, psychology, sociology, English, medical-surgical nursing, and 354 hours of clinical experience under supervised observation.

Sister Mary Scholastica, director of the School of Nursing, opened the program. Following blessing of the caps by Father Paul Cuddy, hospital chaplain, Mrs. Evelyn Lander of the faculty removed the white

caps of the women students and Sister Scholastica placed the new cap on their heads. Three male students had the stripe pinned on their sleeve.


