Abortion Repeal Urged

Terming the abortion of a human fetus "homicide," delegates to the state conventions of the Catholic Central (Verein) Union and its auxiliary last week called for repeal of the liberalizing amendment to the state's abortion law and defeat of legislators or candidates who

approve it.

More than 100 delegates from throughout the state attended the three day conclaves, held in the Sheraton Hotel Sept. 18-20.

Among resolutions adopted was one deploring the abortion amendment and calling for its repeal by the 1970 Legislature. It declared:

"To this end we strongly urge our members to work diligently for the defeat of all candidates for election to the Senate and Assembly who had any part in the passage of this amendment to the criminal law on abortion at the 1970 session of the Legislature, and also those other candidates for the Senate and Assembly who express approval and support of such amendment."

William Roeger, president of the Central Union's Rochester branch, was elected state president, succeeding L. Frank Mit-ter of Troy.

Bishop Hogan, in a talk at the conventions' closing dinner

Sunday afternoon, lauded the organizations as "a truly apostolic" group with "an enviable record" in many fields of religious action and social reform.

The Bishop celebrated Mass for delegates on Sunday morning in St. Joseph's Church, Franklin Street, at which Bishop James E. Kearney delivered the homily.

The CCU originated in Rochester in 1854 as a federation of Catholic German societies. The Rochester group has 33 affiliates with a total membership of more than 2,000.

Hospital School Closed in Selma

A school of practical nursing conducted in Selma, Ala., by the Rochester Sisters of St. Joseph has been discontinued after 20 years of operation.

The final class of 14, graduated Sept. 20, made a total of 350 nurses trained at Good Samaritan Hospital since 1950.

Rising costs and a scarcity of teachers were given as reasons for closing the school. The hospital's board of governors noted also that practical nursing was taught in vocational and trade schools in the area.

Good Samaritan Hospital is owned by the Edmundite Fathers. Four Sisters from this diocese work there, and six others teach in a parish school which the Edmundites operate. Sister Mary Christopher has been director of the nursing school.


