The young often turn against "the establishment" because "the establishment" had no time for them when they were little children, a group of parents was reminded this week.

Mother and father, the principal authorities in a child's world, should share the big moments of his kindergarten-cub scout life, Dr. and Mrs. Joseph Ricotta pointed out. They addressed a meeting in Gates-Chili High School sponsored by the Christian Family Movement of St. Christopher's parish.

Dr. Ricotta, a Buffalo gynecologist, and his wife of 23 years drew on their experience as high school and college teachers of marriage and family life courses in giving advice on "Fortifying Your Marriage."

They urged their listeners to take stock periodically to see whether marriage has achieved its early promises, so that deficiencies can be corrected. They stressed the importance of a family's taking time to do things together, and of the parents' presenting a united front to their children.

The Rev. Arthur Meloche, a Canadian lecturer, will give the second talk in this three-part CFM series at 8 p.m. Oct. 15, at Gates-Chili High. "Divorce vs. Lasting Love" is his topic.

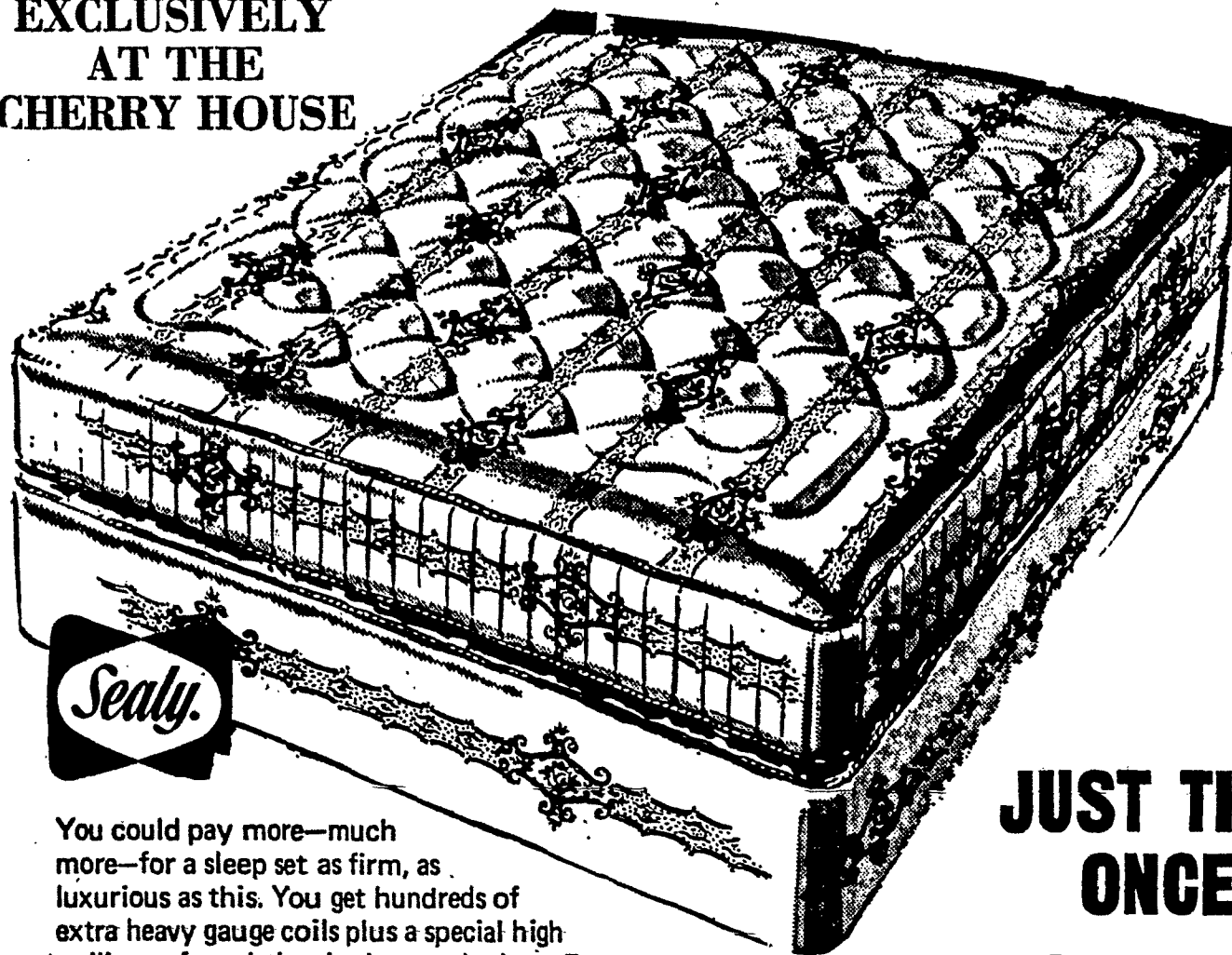
