Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — Actress Helen Hayes, often called the First Lady of the American Theater, will serve as a member of the communications committee of the U.S. Catholic Conference Department of Communications.

Composed of lay persons and bishops, the 2-member committee meets regularly to recommend policy for the department and its four divisions — motion pictures, radio, and television, office of information and news service.

Miss Hayes has received top awards in every acting medium. She made her stage debut at the age of five in Washington, D.C. where she was born. The widow of playwright Charles McArthur, she is the mother of film and television star, James McArthur. She lives at Nyack, N.Y.

Retired Colonel Heads NCCM

Washington —(NC)— Joseph F. Carroll, first to head the nation's Defense Intelligence Agency, is new executive director of the National Council of Catholic Men (NCCM).

Carroll, 60, a retired Air Force lieutenant colonel, will assume his duties Oct. 12, succeeding Martin H. Work who has held the post since 1950. Work will be consultant for planning and programming in the Denver archdiocese.

Carroll once studied for the priesthood and now is father of a priest. He received the Outstanding Catholic Layman Award "Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice" from the late Pope John XXIII.

Divorce Bill Nears Test

Rome—(RNS)—The Italian Senate began final debate here on the controversial divorce bill, with political experts forecasting its approval by a small majority.

Meanwhile, the Christian Democrat Party and the Catholic Church continued their campaigns to have the bill defeated, or at least diluted through various amendments. The bill which would allow divorce in Italy for the first time was approved by the Chamber of Deputies last November, in the 13th effort in a century.

Pope's Birthday a Routine Day

Vatican City —(NC)— Pope Paul VI left the celebration of his 73rd birthday Sept. 26 to others, while he put in a regular day of work.

As always, the Pope paid little attention to the event. Like most Europeans, he does not celebrate his birthday. It is the "name day" that is stressed; that is, the feast day of the patron saint.

Nevertheless, birthday greetings were sent to the Pope in a multitude of languages over Vatican Radio. The Vatican daily newspaper, L'Osservatore Romano, sent its "good wishes and devotions." The Pope also received greetings from heads of state throughout the world, including President Josip Broz (Tito) of Yugoslavia.

Canada's Bishops Back Brazil's

Ottawa, Ontario — (BC) — The Canadian Catholic Conference (CCC) issued a statement here condemning tortures in Brazil and expressing hope that the Canadian government would "bring pressure to bear on the Brazilian authorities through various international agencies such as the United States."

The statement was contained in a letter sent by the CCC to the Brazilian Bishops Council, expressing solidarity with the latter.
