Sister Agnes

Sister Agne de Sales Hennessey, SSJ., who retired several months ago after 40 years of teaching in diocesan schools, died Sept. 28, 1970, in St. Mary's Hospital. The funeral was held last Wednesday at the St. Joseph Motherhouse.

Sister's last assignment was at St. John's, Greece. She had taught at St. Francis Xavier and St. Bridget's in Rochester; at Nativity, in Brockport, and in Auburn and Elmira. She was named principal of St. Mary's Horseheads, when it was opened in 1959.

A native of Rochester, Sister Agnes entered the convent from Holy Rosary parish in 1926. She leaves a brother and two sisters, George, Jane and Mary Hennessey.

Msgr. Kelly, Headed NCWC

A Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated Friday, Oct. 2, for the repose of the soul of Msgr. John E. Kelly in St. James the Less Church, Jamesburg, N.J., where he had been pastor for the past eight years.

A native of Rochester, Msgr. Kelly was ordained a priest May 18, 1940, by Bishop James E. Kearney. From 1955-62, Msgr. Kelly served as director of the Bureau of Information for the National Catholic World Conference Service.

Bishop George Ahr of the Diocese of Trenton was principal concelebrant of the Mass of Resurrection.

Msgr. Kelly was a member of the National Press Club, the Catholic Broadcasters Association and the Knights of Columbus.
