Chemung Unit Studies Possible School Merger

Elmira — Possible consolidation of Chemung County's seven Catholic elementary schools is under study by a new committee headed by Auxiliary Bishop McCafferty.

The 14-person unit was formed at the recommendation of the Chemung County Catholic School Board to work with a larger diocesan Educational Task Force recently designated by Bishop Hogan. Comprising representatives of area priests, sisters and laity, the committee is intended to provide a local voice in planning the fu-ture of Catholic education in the county.

Bishop McCafferty explained that the coordinating committee would not deal with parishes or churches, but would concentrate on the possibilities for school consolidation. Bish-

op Hogan has made it clear, he said, that he does not intend to "disturb the parish structure of Chemung County in the foreseeable future."

Committee members held their second meeting last night, Oct. 13.

Their task involves an analysis of area pre-school population figures; the collection of data on population mobility and availability of religious per-sonnel; budget analysis of local parishes and publicizing the goals of Catholic education.

The Chemung County Catho-lic elementary schools have experienced a steady enrollment decline since 1964, when they hit a peak of 2,944 students. Current enrollment is 1,698 pupils, nearly 10 percent off last year's total of 1,871.
