## 4 Southern Tier Candidates **Back More Parochiaid**

Elmira-Four candidates for the state legislature, two Republican incumbents and two Democratic challengers, went on record for increased state aid to private schools before a large crowd at Notre Dame High School last week.

More than 700 people were on hand to hear the candidates also agree that they were in favor of repealing the Blaine amendment, which restricts state aid to parochial schools.

The candidates were Sen. William T. Smith, Rep.-Cons., of Big Flats and his opponent, John B. Schamel, Dem., of Chemung; Republican Assem-blyman L. Richard Marshall of Elmira and his Democratic opponent, Samuel Karam, also of Elmira.

Sen. Smith and Assemblyman Marshall cited their consistent support of previous bills destined to help private schools. Marshall noted that if the parochial schools in the state were forced to close due to high costs, it could cost the state \$1 billion more a year to take care of the students in public schools. "It would be a financial disaster," he stressed.

Senatorial candidate Schamel also supported aid to parochial schools, "as long as it can be done constitutionally." A for-mer public school teacher, he reminded the audience that public schools also face huge problems today, adding "as Catholics, we also have a re-sponsibility to the community at large."

Samuel Karam, running for assemblyman, complimented Chemung County Catholics for their generous support of parochial schools. He criticized the Republican Legislature in Albany for delays in getting such bills as textbook aid enacted.
