Harold J. Coleman Dies At 74; Lay Leader

Mass of the Resurrection for Harold J. Coleman of Brighton, a leading Catholic layman and active in many civic endeavors, was celebrated Monday morning at Our Lady of Lourdes Church.

Mr. Coleman, 74, died Friday, Oct. 23, 1970, in St. Mary's Hospital. He was the originator and one of the founders of the Daily Mass League, which just recently changed its title to The Mass League. Organized in 1951, it has gained worldwide acceptance and now numbers more than 40,000 members.

Mr. Coleman was chairman of the board of Will Corp., now Will Scientific Inc., distributors of materials for chemical laboratories. He was board president of the John F. Wegman Foundation, and a board member of St. Mary's Hospital, Columbus Civic Center, and St. John Fisher College.

Born in Rochester, he attended St. Andrew's Seminary and Rochester Business Institute. He was a Navy veteran of World War I.

Seen Possible

Brooklyn, N.Y. — (NC) — Bishop Francis J. Mugavero of Brooklyn in a radio interview here endorsed a suggestion that married men be permitted to become priests.

After heading a membership drive for the Columbus Youth Association in 1939, Mr. Coleman helped raise money for several Catholic institutions, and in 1960 was chairman of a drive which raised \$6 million for Bishop Kearney and Cardinal Mooney High Schools.

The question of celibacy in the priesthood did not come up. The suggestion concerned men already married who desire to become priests.


His greatest Catholic interest during the last few years had been The Mass League, which he termed "The Golden Hour of the Day." It was in the 1920s that he embarked on a crusade to bring the laity's attention to

Explaining his position, the bishop said "historically, this has happened in the Church" and in some parts of the world today national conferences of bishops have asked the Holy See to revive the practice. "I think there is certainly room for this kind of spiritual leadership in the Church," he said.
