## CYO Announces Annual Fun Day

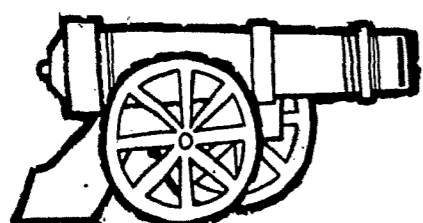
The annual CYO Fun day for boys and girls aged six through 12 is scheduled for Nov. 27, the day after Thanksgiving, at 50 Chestnut Street.

## Big Night Coming At St. Michael's

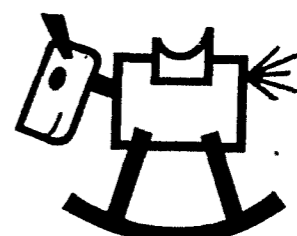
An old fashioned 65-cent buffet supper will accompany the fun and games at St. Michael's "Turkey Roundup" next Saturday night, Nov. 21.

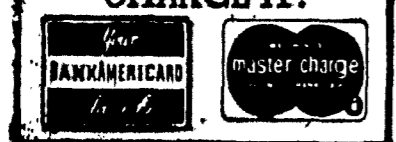
