Hospital's 'Outreach' Has \$1 Million Goal

Elmira — St. Joseph Hospital's million dollar fund drive has brought pledges thus far of \$443,845, chairman Clarence Brobst reported to 150 advance gift workers attending the kick-off dinner last week.

The Women's auxiliary achieved its goal of \$150,000,

while hospital employees exceeded theirs, \$100,000, turning in pledges of \$101,041.

Members of the board of directors pledged \$71,000; the medical staff, \$76,360; school of nursing alumnae, \$10,000, and various other sources, \$35,444.

The campaign, dubbed Operation Outreach, is being directed in the advance gift stage by four area businessmen, Charles Baltzel, area manager for New York State Electric and Gas; Carl Berry, board chairman, Marine Midland Trust; Russell Johnson, a Bendix vice president, and James A. Norris, president of Streeter Associates.

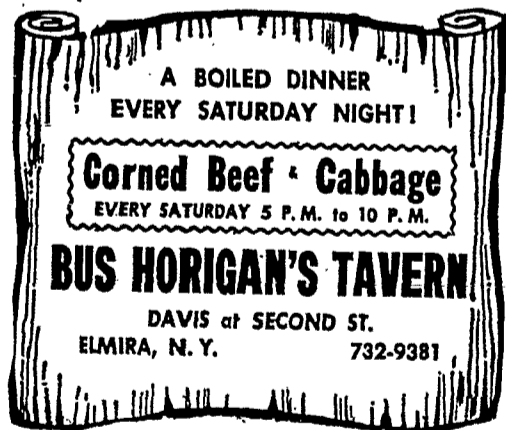

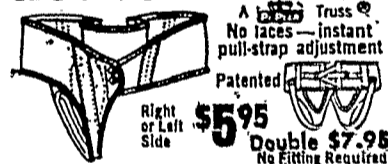
