Each weekend at Aquinas Stadium this past fall, football was the name of the game.

Rochester's four Catholic high schools, Aquinas Institute, McQuaid Jesuit, Bishop Kearney and Cardinal Mooney, played their home games there.

Biggest crowd of the season at the Mt. Read park was 14,000 fans who saw Aquinas defeat Fairport, 18-12, in a historical game which pitted a Catholic high school team against a public high school team for the first time in 25 years.

The Little Irish of Aquinas won the Catholic League crown by defeating the other three schools. McQuaid took runnerup honors.

The last Sunday afternoon game at the Stadium was between Bishop Kearney and Cardinal Mooney, in sometimes rainy weather.

All in all, and in consideration of the bad weather which hovered throughout the season, the number of grid fans who turned out for the games was quite good.

In the BK-Mooney contest, by the way, BK won, 32-14.
