Five Cited For English Achievement

Four girls in the Rochester area, all Catholic high school seniors, have been named as outstanding students of English, in a nationwide competition conducted by the National Council of Teachers of English.

They are Deborah Anne Dooly of Mercy High School; Mary Catherine Hennon of Bishop Kearney; Mary Ellen Wojtasiewicz, St. Agnes, and Frances Angela Pullano, Nazareth Academy. In addition, Jeanne M. Barton of Kearney was selected as a runner-up.

Of the original 8,000 nominees entered by their own schools, 872 were cited as outstanding, and will be recommended to colleges by the teachers' council. They represent more than 600 schools in the 30 states and District of Columbia, and American preparatory schools abroad. Each school was allowed one nominee for every 500 students in the junior class last Spring. Nominees later submitted writing samples including an impromptu essay, and competed in standardized tests.

Mercy Sisters

Receive Bequest

The Sisters of Mercy of Rochester receive \$5,000 under the will of Harold J. Coleman of Brighton.

Mr. Coleman, who died Oct. 23 at the age of 74, made the bequest in memory of his daughter, Sister Mary Mark.

His will added \$100,000 to the endowment of a charitable foundation he established in 1960, and provided \$5,000 for the Sacred Hearts Fathers of Fairhaven, Mass., and \$500 for Marywood College in Scranton.

Mr. Coleman was a former chairman of Will Scientific, Inc., a distributor of laboratory materials.

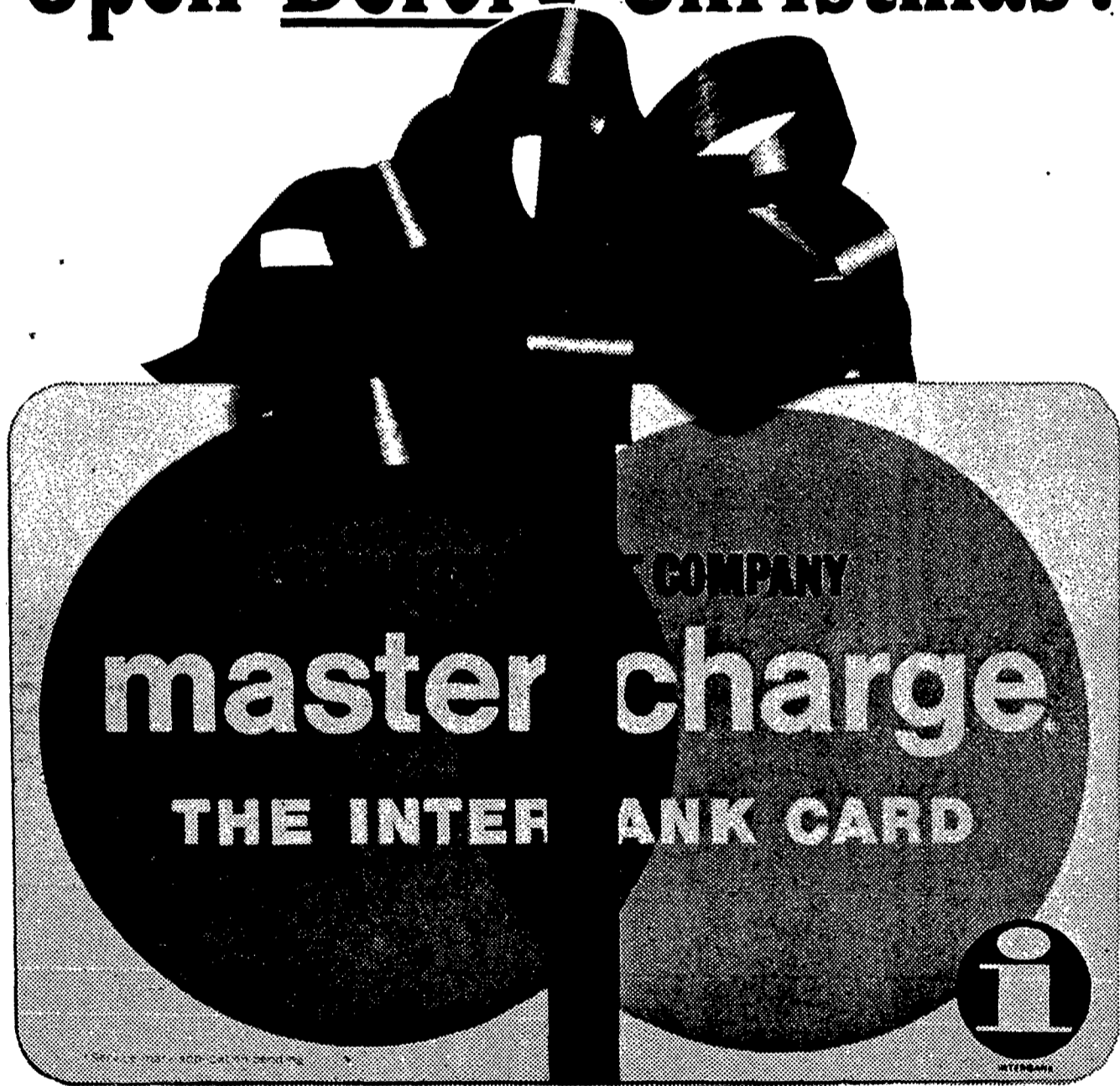
