## U.N. Fund Advocated To Fight Drug Abuse

United Nations, N.Y.—(RNS) — The Economic and Social Council of the United Nations has decided to request Secretary-General U Thant to establish — as an initial measure and as a matter of urgency — a United Nations fund for drug-abuse control through voluntary contributions.

Msgr. Alberto Giovanetti, the Vatican's representative, said the Catholic Church is particularly interested in the widespread problem of drug abuse.

Valuable research has been done on this problem, he said, but additional information and education is needed to alert people to the dangers of narcotics.

Msgr. Giovanetti called drug abuse "a fatal plague" that must be controlled, and said the draft resolution is an effective means to help control this problem.

The resolution was adopted by a vote of 22 in favor, to none against with 2 abstentions.
