**London** — (**RNS**) — The British Medical Association has named a special committee to inquire into the way abortion laws in Britain are being interpreted by doctors. "The committee intends to a dvise the government on changes in the law or changes in the way the law is applied," said an association spokesman.

Prof. Ian Donald of Glasgow

University, chairman of the committee, said, "I believe a lot of people are making a monkeyout of Parliament. Some interpret the law as making abortion available on demand; but this is not what Parliament intended."


#### Mrs. Marconi
