Fisher Adds Film Course

The vice president of St. John Fisher College will be one of two instructors in a new course offered next semester at the college entitled, "The Celluloid Medium."

Father Joseph B. Dorsey, vice president for academic affairs, will team up with Louis Gian-sante, a Fisher graduate and now media coordinator in the college's Department of Instructional Resources, in offering the course Tuesdays and Thursdays at 11:30 a.m.

Students will be encouraged to try film making — mostly in the Super 8 format — but through the facilities of the Department of Instructional Resources, limited opportunities will be available for work in 16 mm and/or videotape. However, the emphasis of the course will be on viewing films, shorts and feature length, both inside and out of the classroom.

This course will be aimed at achieving an understanding of the language of visual communication, that is, of the grammar of film making in order to better make judgments.

Prof. Ian Donald of Glasgow

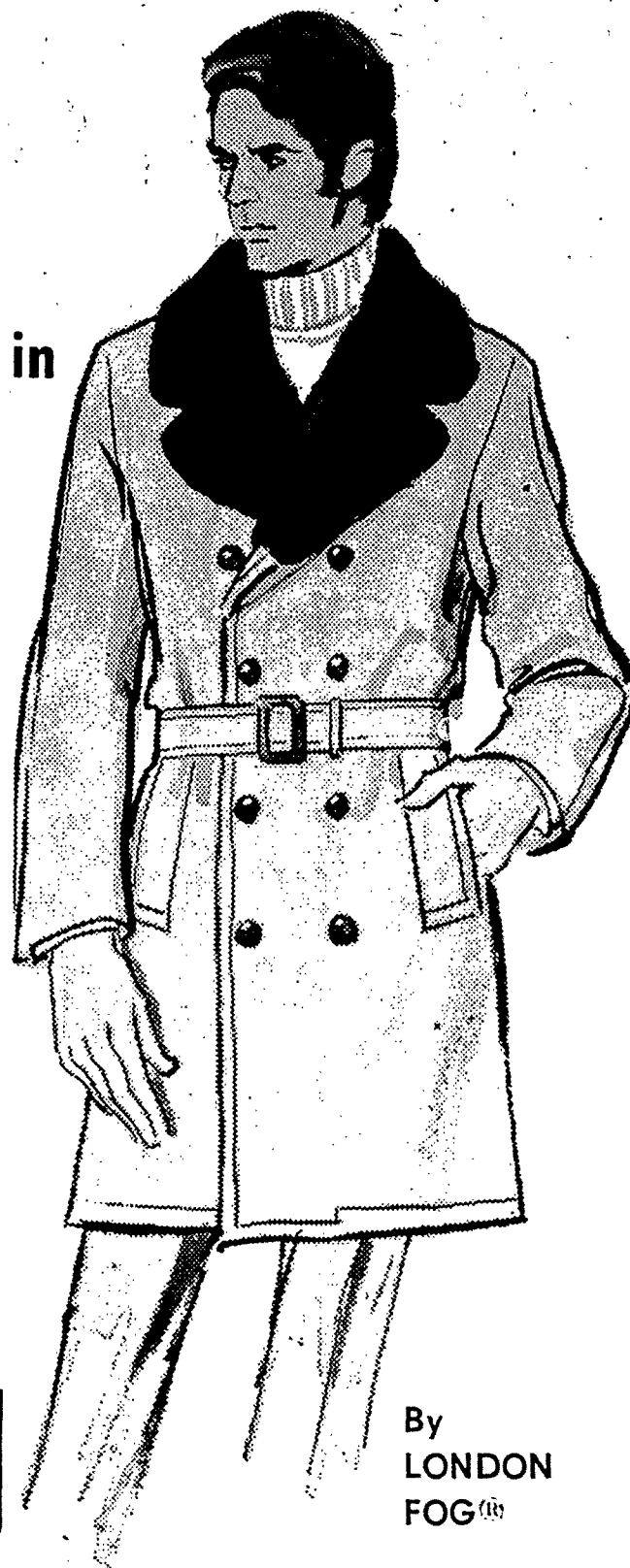
