'Magnificent Encounters'

Pope Paul Talks about Asian Tour

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI, in his first address since his return from Asia and the South Pacific, thanked God for having saved him from an attempt on his life in Manila.

It was the Pope's first public reference to the attempted knifing attack by a Bolivian painter, Benjamin Mendoza y Amor Flores, moments after the Pope had stepped from his plane at Manila Airport on Nov. 27.

Addressing a larger crowd than usual in St. Peter's Square at noon on Dec. 6, the pontiff invited pilgrims to join him in giving thanks to the Lord for "happily preserving us from an attack" that was "an insane gesture," which, "fortunately, was an isolated gesture that had no negative consequence whatsoever."

The Pope then spoke of the "magnificent encounters" of his 10-day journey. "You have certainly heard about them from the press, the radio and television," he said, "and we would like to think that you have understood their religious and ecclesial value."

claim any personal credit for the enthusiastic receptions accorded.

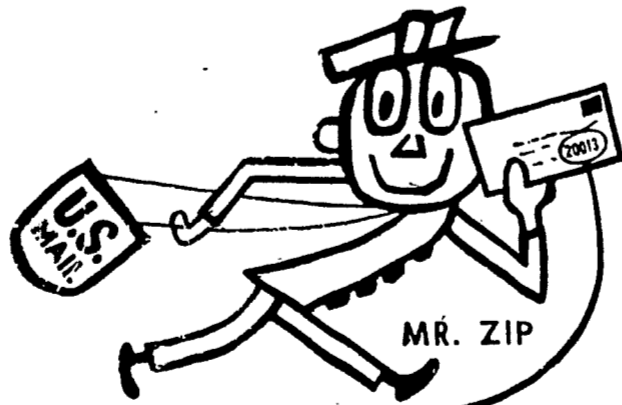
The outpouring of love and esteem, he said, was due "rather to the fact that we came from Rome, from the center and heart of the Catholic Church, and to the fact that we, as the successor of the apostles Peter and Paul, are, for all the faithful, for every bishop, a brother and friend and the representative of the centuries-old mandate of Christ Himself."

The Pope also referred to the legalization of divorce in Italy.

"This is an event that we consider most unfortunate, for many reasons and especially for the love we have for the Italian people.

"We allude to it now with the hope that there may arise in your hearts the consciousness of the word 'Catholic.'

"May you never forget it. May you always be faithful, animated by a living and loyal affection to your Catholic country . . . which has a providential role of giving distinct and independent hospitality to the Holy See."
