War as Evil as Abortion, RACL Says

Catholic bishops of the nation should be expending as much time and energy against war as they are against abortion, according to the Rochester Association of Catholic Layme**n**.

In a Christmas message "On Human Life" issued last week the RACL charged the bishops with failing to issue a pastoral letter on the war in Indo-China and "the dehumanizing aspects of American society like racism, militarism and the lack of concern for poverty."

In an accompanying memo, the RACL posed the question "What Can We Do for Peace?" and offered the following suggestions:

Demand an end to war now; demand of religious leaders that they take a stand against the war and address themselves to the issues of peace and jus-

tice; write letters of protest to the President and Congress; encourage legislation providing transition to a peacetime economy . . .

Protest the priorities that allocate the vast majority of the tax dollar to military and allied purposes at a time when problems of poverty, racism, drugs and pollution have reached crisis proportions; withhold taxes; vote for peace candi-dates; demand that national self-interest be subordinated to the common good of the community of nations.

Declaring that "it is the opin-ion of RACL that the Catholic Church as an institution has failed to devote its moral and material resources to the Peace world of today."

"If we seem to blame our religious leaders in this letter. it is not to exonerate ourselves. All of us should be the Church, the 'People of God' as the Vatican II Council asserted, and we are all responsible for the mission of the Church in the modern world.

"If the institutional Church does not fulfill its mission, then the reason might be our own laxness, our preoccupation with our 'own business' and our failure to transform the Church into a real 'People of God' devoted to the applications of the Message of the Gospel to the
