18 Priests Elected To Diocesan Council

Eighteen priests were elected this month to two-year terms on the diocesan Priests' Council, which will hold its organization meeting on Tuesday, Jan. 5.

Two religious order priests, to be selected by the orders themselves, also will be added to the council membership.

Twelve diocesan priests, elected in a mail poll by the clergy, represent approximately 26 priests each in their respective age groupings. Six others were chosen to represent geographic areas.

Three members of the present council were re-elected. They are Father Joseph M. McDonnell, Msgr. George A. Cocuzzi and Father Charles Mulligan.

Council members in order of seniority are Msgr. John M. Duffy, retired; Father McDonnell, St. Michael's Church, Newark; Father Raymond G. Heisel, St. Margaret Mary, Irondequoit; Msgr. Richard K. Burns, St. Thomas the Apostle, Irondequoit; Father George S. Wood, Our Mother of Sorrows; Father Robert A. Meng, Holy Rosary, Rochester; Msgr. Cocuzzi, Holy Family, Rochester; Father Joseph P. Brennan, rector, St. Bernard's Seminary; Father Daniel Tormey, chaplain, Rochester General Hospital; Father Anthony Valente, chaplain, Our Lady of Mercy High School; Father Charles Mulligan, taking graduate studies at Cornell

University; Father James A. Schwartz, St. Theodore's Church, Gates.

Geographic election results were as follows:

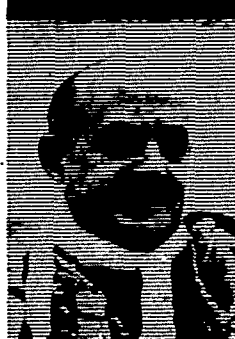
