

## Aquinas Host To Color Guards

Aquinas Institute's state champion color guard will host the top high school color guards of the state at its annual "Color Salute" Saturday, Jan. 30.

The star-studded program, to begin at 7 p.m. in the school gymnasium, will feature eight guards in competition and an exhibition by the host guard.

A highlight will be the appearance of the Wildcat Color Guard of West Genesee High School in Camillus, one of the top guards in the nation. Also participating will be Sherbourne Central School, Nazareth Academy, Bishop Kearney, Tri-Town Cadets, Wavettes, Grey Knights and the Greece Cadets.

The Aquinas color guard has won the state championship for six of the past eight years. For the past four years the local boys have captured the International Color Guard Circuit championship. The 17-man precision drill team has marched in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, in Detroit's Christmas Parade, in Cleveland, New Orleans, Washington, Atlanta and Toronto.
