Melkite Church Spruces Up

For several weeks the interior of St. Nicholas Church on Remington Street has been undergoing redecoration by the pastor and trustees.

Repainting was the principal activity in the renovation, according to Father Athanasius Hassey, pastor. More than \$2,000 was expended on the project.

Principal assistants on the job were the parish trustees, William Nealon and Thomas Nesser.

The small brick and wood structure, at Remington and Leo streets was erected by some 50 (now 200) Melkites who followed the liturgical Byzantine Rite. It was dedicated Oct. 30, 1927, by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey.

Founders were emigrants from Syria, Lebanon, the Holy Land and other Near East countries, known generally as Catholics of the Eastern Rite. They are one of 23 parishes in the Melkite Apostolic Exarchate (Diocese), established in 1966 for some 50,000 Byzantine Catholics of the Melkite Rite.

Establishment of a Right to Life Committee in parishes throughout the diocese is the goal of the Rochester committee, according to Father Robert L. Collins, diocesan representative on the committee.

Father Collins is director of the Family Life Office of the diocesan Department of Education. Discussing the Right to Life purposes, Father Collins declared:

"It aims to change the attitude of those who would advocate abortion and euthanasia as solutions to the problems of overpopulation, family planning, psychological stress, unwed mothers, and a host of other very real difficulties.

"By 'change the attitude' we mean providing better solutions to these problems, solutions which do not threaten the rights of the unborn and those about to die. We do not pretend to have easy solutions. We do have the willingness to work for them."

is at 11 a.m. Mass prayers are in English, and can easily be followed by Mass leaflets available in the pews. Among outstanding points of the liturgy is the singing by priest, choir and congregation.

During the last few months Father Hassey has celebrated Byzantine Rite Masses in several Roman Catholic churches, accompanied by his choir. He will be pleased to do this in other parishes.

The liturgical season of LENT is approaching; it is a time to take a "spiritual inventory" . . . a time of penance. Before we begin the Lenten season, let us examine the meaning of that word "penance." Penance in the Greek is METANOIA, meaning a "change of heart." In this sense, whatever we DO as "penance" should effect a change in the attitudes or dispositions that bind us to our selves; to change whatever keeps us from really going out in love for others. What others? All others!

But how can we do that? We can give of ourselves (our lives) to our family, friends, and acquaintances by giving of our time, patience, understanding, work, or just by being present and available. This can be "penance" enough, especially when we're just not in the mood for whatever demand is made on us at the time.

Whatever you "give" or "give-up" to make this Lent personally meaningful, do it, not for yourself, but for others! Missionaries and their suffering-poor need you more than anyone else in the world — please make your metanoia in Lent a giving to them.

Your love (your life) gives them a meaning in life . . . it gives them Easter. Begin today. Send a generous gift for the missions right now — more than a gift — make it a real sacrifice.
