The conference is open to physicians, educators, health planners, political scientists, health insurers and persons interested in the health care problem.

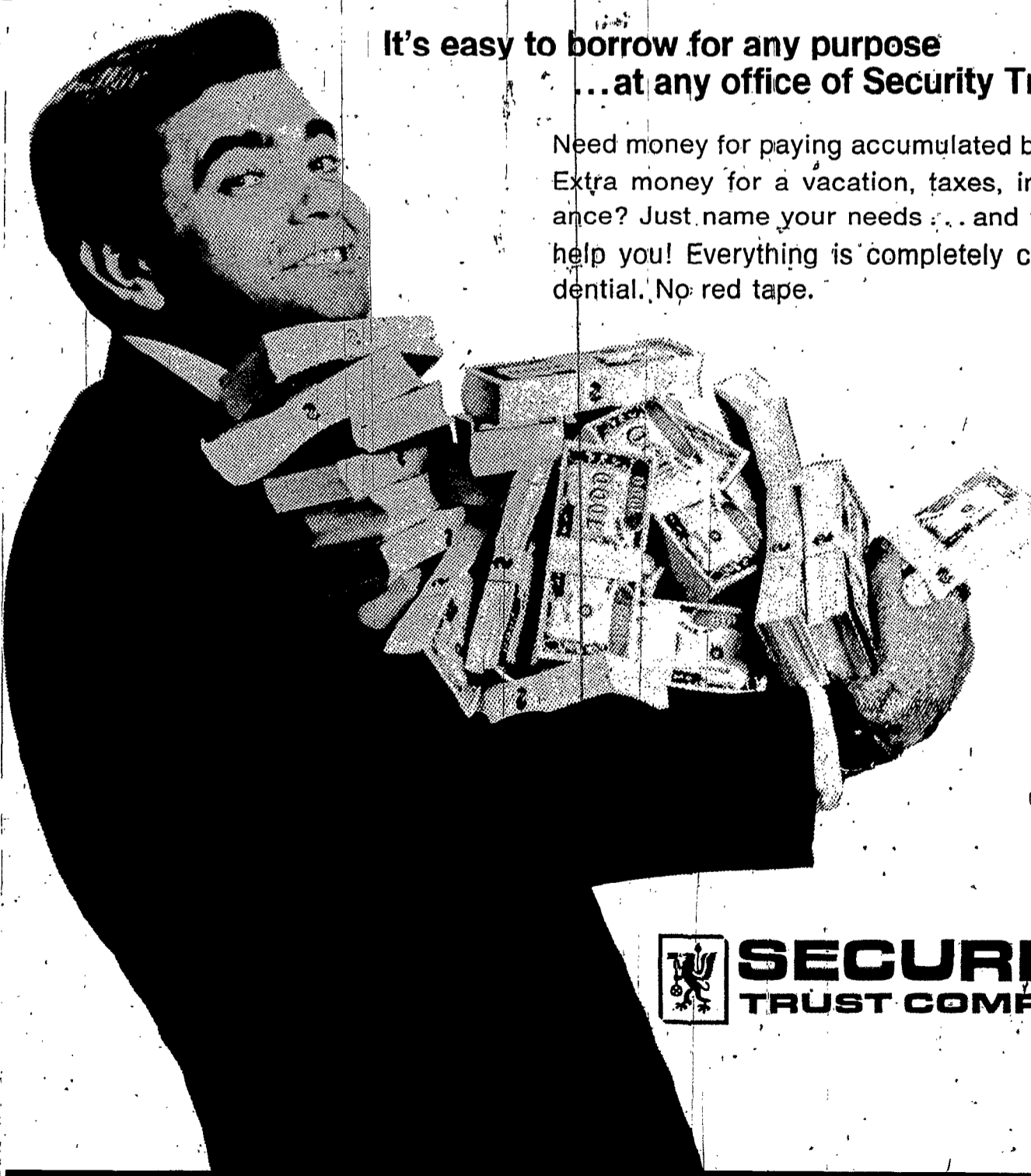
