Pope Praises U.S. Bishops

Vatican City —(RNS)—Pope Paul said here that the American bishops are not only attempting to abolish poverty at home but they have not forgotten the many millions of poor throughout the world.

In a special message to the U.S. bishops, the Pope praised the 25th annual Catholic Relief Overseas Aid Fund Appeal slated to culminate March 21 with a national collection.

"It is more than ever essential," he said, "that the people of God take care of its brothers and sisters, men and women everywhere." Stressing a re-awakening in the Church concerning the demands of Scripture, Pope Paul said that one of the most urgent needs of fraternal solidarity was to reduce poverty throughout the world.

Workshop Set On '3rd World'

Students of St. Bernard's Seminary will host a unique "Workshop on the Third World" at the seminary from this Friday evening through Sunday afternoon, March 21.

Thirty-five invited participants headed by members of the U.S. Bishops' Division of World Justice and Peace will probe root issues of the imbalance between the over- and underprivileged nations of the world and the Christian response to the problems.
