The award also includes a \$100 savings bond presented by the Women's Committee of the Civic Music Association.

K of C Offers Student Loans

Students affiliated with the Knights of Columbus will be able to borrow money from the organization this fall to help them continue their studies.

As much as \$1,500 a year for five years is available to a student who belongs to the K of C, or whose father or husband is a member. Repayment, at seven per cent interest, is to begin no later than a year after studies cease and to be completed within five to 10 years.

Diocesan students who wish to take advantage of this new program should write for applications and certificate of membership forms to the Student Loan Committee, Knights of Columbus, PO Box 1670, New Haven, Conn. 06507. The applications must be returned to that office by June 1.

The loan program is guaranteed by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare. An agency spokesman said the K of C was the first fraternal organization to enter the student loan field.

The announcement from New Haven said that the borrower must have been accepted for at least half-time study in a degree granting institution, a major seminary or vocational school listed among 7,525 institutions approved by the government. A student from a family with \$15,000 gross adjusted annual income would have to pay the interest throughout the term of the loan, but the government would pay interest during the college years if the borrower's family resources were less than \$15,000.

Economics Study Set for Clergy

About 50 clergymen from the Rochester, Buffalo, and Syracuse areas will assemble at the Trenholm East at Farmington April 25 for a five-day course in economics.

It will be the seventh annual Western New York Clergy Economic Education Conference, sponsored by the State University at Buffalo and the national Clergy Economic Education Foundation. University economists and labor, agriculture and business experts will discuss such matters as inflation

and consumer problems, automation, the price and market system, income distribution and poverty. The cost of the program is underwritten by various organizations and individuals.

Chairmen of the planning committee are Charles E. Fitzgibbon of Kodak and William P. Blackmon of Rochester Products Division, General Motors. Father William J. Flynn, diocesan vice chancellor, is on the clergy's planning committee for the Rochester area.
