Auburn United Fund Hears Fr. Charbonneau

Auburn — "Seek out the human needs in the community and meet them," was the thrust of the message delivered by Father William Charbonneau at the 48th annual meeting and award dinner of the United Fund of Cayuga County here.

Father Charbonneau, diocesan director of Catholic Charities, served in Auburn as interim director of Auburn Catholic Family Center in 1958.

In reviewing the development of formalized charity, he illustrated how the roles of a voluntary agency may change with expanding social awareness and responsibility on the part of the

governmental social and welfare programs.

He encouraged 100 volunteers at the dinner to demonstrate how by working together in organizing social service programs, all members of the community may receive help.

Father Charbonneau praised the motivation of the volunteers and encouraged them in even greater community service in the coming year.
