Mandated Services Funds Allocation

Funds allocated to the diocese are part of a \$10,107,898.68 total paid so far to 1,365 non-public schools throughout the state. An equal amount will be sent to the schools after April 1, which will complete payment of the new \$28 million state program of direct emergency state aid.

Payment is made on the basis of 15 cents a day for each elementary school pupil and 25 cents a day for each secondary school pupil.

The funds may be used to administer certain nonsectarian,

noninstructional programs, many of which state law mandates. They include such areas as the administration and grading of various examinations, the maintenance of attendance and pupil health records, and the keeping of certain teacher personnel data.

Wrong Reveals Right, School Principals Hear

"What's wrong with our schools?" is a question guaranteed to produce a good-sized assembly, the East Irondequoit School superintendent advised parish school principals at a recent meeting.

And when people have come to talk about what's wrong, "they'll go away with some knowledge of what's right," Daniel Healy continued.

At a diocesan-wide meeting of elementary school administrators, March 15 in Canandaigua, Healy spoke of the tensions

that build up between the administration and the public, and the administration and the school board. He told the principals they should maintain lines of communication with both, and keep their boards "as fully informed as possible."

"You must realize that all board members may not love you," Healy added. "You have to learn to live with this." And "if you don't smile, you have to learn to smile. If you don't have a sense of humor, I don't think you can get through administration."
