Easter Anniversary For Annunciation Pastor

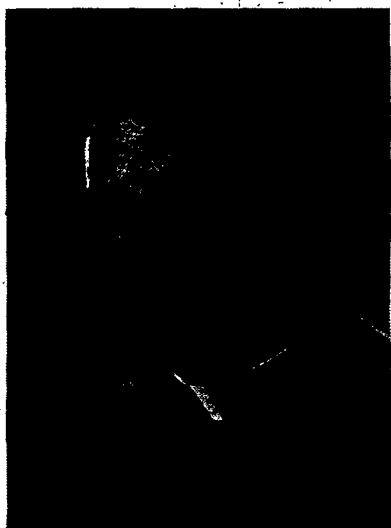
Msgr. Albert L. Simonetti, pastor of the Church of the Annunciation, will reach the 35th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood this Easter Sunday.

He will note the occasion on Holy Thursday by celebrating Mass at 11 a.m. for the children, in the school he built.

April 11, 1936 was Holy Saturday, Msgr. Simonetti recalls. He was ordained that day in Rome, at St. John Lateran, having finished his seminary education at the Pontifical College at Anagni, Italy, near Rome.

He was born and brought up in Rochester, attending Holy Rosary School and Aquinas, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries. As administrator of St. Anthony's, Elmira, when church and school were burned out in 1947, he directed a rebuilding campaign.

In his next assignment, he went through a similar experience, establishing a school at

Annunciation and putting up a modern church that opened in 1967. The church at 1754 Norton replaced one that had been damaged by fire 10 years earlier. Msgr. Simonetti has been pastor of Annunciation since 1953.

Regional Health Director Warns of Epidemic Danger

"Rural communities as well as urban areas this year face the prospect of large scale epidemics of measles, polio and diphtheria, if more emphasis is not placed on immunizing children against these preventable diseases," Dr. William G. Hafner, regional health director of the State Department of Health has declared.

"No precise figures are available yet on the immunity status of children in the 11-county Rochester region," he added, "but counties in the Southern Tier of the region are vastly under-utilizing the vaccine now being offered through public health programs."

Dr. Hafner noted that officials are increasingly concerned over epidemic possibilities, in view of recent outbreaks of polio and diphtheria, particularly in the Southwest part of the country where there has been low priority on routine immunization of children

Priest Questions Parish Concept

San Juan, P.R. — (RNS) — It is the task of each priest "to remodel his priesthood" to fit the needs of the community, and "there is no single model of what a priest ought to and can be," said Father John F. Talbot, S.J., writing in a secular newspaper here.

He questioned the pastoral efficiency of the traditional Catholic parish, venturing that the spread of more basic communities would speed the rise of "natural" Christian leaders, especially in the diaconate program.

Observing that the diaconate could lead to the ordination of married community leaders, the

Jesuit superior noted that the result would be an entirely new model of the priesthood: "married, mature, proved in service to the community before ordination . . . and rooted in consciousness of the world and sacred secularity."

He said that as a priest in 1971, he feels "insecure, threatened from above and below."
