Deaths

Sister Barbara

Sister Barbara Sobota, of the Sisters of St. Joseph, a teacher in diocesan parochial schools for more than 50 years, died in St. Joseph Convent, East Avenue, on Friday evening, April 2, after a long illness.

Born in Silicia, Poland, Sister Barbara left her native land in 1894 to enter the Sisters of St. Joseph here. She had come in response to solicitation by Bishop McQuaid for young Polish children.

Following three years of intensive study of the English language and the teacher training courses in the Motherhouse then on Jay Street, she, with two other Sisters opened St. Stanislaus School in 1897. Twelve years later she was transferred to Auburn, then to Elmira, and returned to St. Stanislaus for another eight years.

In 1922 he was assigned to St. Casimir, Elmira, where she remained until 1939; when she returned to St. Stanislaus for a third time and taught until her retirement from full time duty in 1956.

H. J. Wintish

Harold J. Wintish of Wellington Avenue, whose three daughters are Sisters of Mercy, died of cancer March 17, 1971, at the age of 65.

Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated March 20 at St. Augustine's by Msgr. John F. Duffy and four other priests. Responses and hymns were sung by the Mercy Sisters.

Survivors include his widow, Beatrice, and a son, J. Peter Wintish. The daughters are Sisters Mary Elizabeth, Margaret Mary and Barbara Joan. Mr. Wintish also leaves four sisters, the Misses Mary and Helen Wintish, Mrs. Roger Haring of Glendale, Ariz., and Mrs. Richard Mulroy; several nieces and nephews.

Sister Ephrem

Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated for Sister Ephrem Ryan, SSJ, on Saturday, April 3, by Father Joseph Reinhart, in the Motherhouse chapel on East Avenue. Present also was Father Donald J. Murphy.

Born in Ireland, Sister Ephrem came to this country in 1899 with a group of young women to enter the Sisters of St. Joseph in Rochester, where she prepared for the teaching profession.

She taught the primary grades in Seneca Falls for 10 years, followed by a teaching assignment in the old St. Patrick's Cathedral School for 19 years. Subsequently she taught for shorter periods in Sacred Heart, Holy Apostles and St. Augustine's schools and also in Penn Yan, Ithaca, and SS. Peter & Paul, Elmira. In 1958 she was assigned to Holy Trinity School, Webster, where she remained until her retirement in 1963.

Auburn Knights Hear Educator at Breakfast

Auburn—Dr. J. Edward Cuddy, professor at Rosary Hill College, Buffalo addressed the approximately 250 men and boys attending the annual Knights of Columbus Communion breakfast, at the Auburn Inn, Sunday, March 28, following 9 a.m. Mass at Holy Family Church.

Dr. Cuddy's theme was based on the quotation from the French philosopher, Jacques Maritain, who said of education, "The great object is to become a person, a real person, and not a carbon copy."

Dr. Cuddy reflected on people as great educational resources

and gave examples of the impact of personalities, such as John F. Kennedy, on the lives of others.

He explained the need of the Catholic Church to project Christ's personality so youth will be attracted and enriched.

He closed by saying there are three kinds of people: those who evaluate their success by what they have, such as income and property, those who measure success by what they do, such as lawyers, carpenters, doctors and the third group, not by what they do and have, but what they are as people.
