A call for diocesan families to host Mexican high school students in a cultural exchange program went out this week from Mr. and Mrs. Donald Perry, heads of the Rochester committee for the International Students' Exchange Program.

Headed by Msgr. Placid Reitmeier, OSB, the Mexico City based organization's purpose is to acquaint Mexican and Central American students with the values and truths of U.S. and Canadian cultures by means of a living experience in them as members of hosting families.

"The responsibility of the host family is to provide room,

board and love for their foreign son or daughter," Perry said. "The student pays for everything else, including transportation costs."

According to Perry, the students are well insured for medical, hospital and surgical care by the organization; and the students will be in the U.S. from July 2 - Aug. 30.

He also indicated that both students and host families are screened and selected by the local committee.
