by what President Nixon calls "The Silent Majority."

Justus Freimund, national affairs director of the National Council on Crime and Delinquency presented the group with models for cheaper and more extensive police protection, and judicial reform.

Jerry Ernst, former writer for the National Catholic News Service and presently with the

Center for Urban Ethnic Affairs of the Roman Catholic Church, in Washington, D.C., spoke of various attempts by the clergy to mobilize coalitions of blacks and whites for political reform.

Stan Skinner, staff director for the North East Area Development Corporation in Rochester, (NEAD) outlined the principles his group follows in maintaining and developing organized efforts among ethnic groups in Rochester.

Baptists Hear Plea For Parent-Aid Bill

Thomas Banaszewski of the Legislative Action Committee—Parent Aid spoke in behalf of the Speno-Lerner Parent Aid School Bill at last Sunday's service at South Avenue Baptist Church.

Banaszewski defended the constitutionality of the bill; predicted dire circumstances for public schools if they have to take on the increased pupil load should private schools be forced to close; described the

high taxation that would result, and asked the congregation to join in efforts to save private schools.

The Rev. Harry Warren III, minister of the church, invited Banaszewski to address the congregation and to answer questions at the church's "talk-back" after services.

The Rev. Warren also called for prayers in behalf of both public and parochial schools.

Fisher Concert to Aid Day Care Center

The Edgerton Day Care Center, only in full operation since last September, will hold a public concert Friday, April 23 in the Lake Avenue Baptist Church, 57 Ambrose St.

The concert will feature the St. John Fisher College Glee Club.

H. Wendell Howard, the club's director, stated that instead of the annual spring concert on campus that members of the Glee Club had voted to

take the concert off campus this year and into the community.

Proceeds will all go to the day care center.

The long-range goal of the Edgerton Day Care Center is to provide day care for children ranging from six months to 12 years of age. The center is currently providing care for children on ADC, children from low-income families, and children from middle-income families.

Sisters Set Teach-in on War

A group of the Sisters of Mercy of the Rochester Diocese (concurrent with this weekend's activities in Washington by peace groups from all over the nation), is sponsoring a public teach-in at the Mercy Motherhouse, 1437 Blossom Road, at 3 p.m. on Sunday, April 25. The teach-in will concern aspects of the war in Indo-China. The public is invited.

The Sisters, all of whom are elected members of the Mercy Congregation's Chapter of Affairs, see the afternoon's efforts as an opportunity to bring to consciousness the need for national decision, as soon as possible, on certain aspects of the conduct of the war, as well as the ultimate end of the war.

At 5 p.m., following the teach-in, there will be a public celebration of the Eucharist, the theme of which will center around citizens' collective responsibility for many moral aspects of the conduct of the war in Vietnam.

Leo Bernard Costello, formerly of Rochester, died April 11, 1971, in a Baltimore hospital, after an illness of six months. Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated April 14 at St. Henry's Church, Bayonne, N.J., with burial on Staten Island.

Mr. Costello was a high school teacher and director of athletics at Port Washington, L.I., until he retired and moved to Fort Lauderdale, Fla., in 1966. He played basketball for Rochester's old Cathedral High School, and was on the football and basketball teams at St. Lawrence University, where he took his bachelor's degree about 40 years ago.

Survivors include his widow, Edith; a daughter, Edith, of Arlington, Va.; a brother, Thomas, Rochester; five sisters, Sister Marion Patricia of Nazareth Hall; Mrs. Frank J.
