Because of the warm response to this first year's performance as well as the joy the Sisters have in producing their programs, the Concert Chorale has continued in existence and this year presenting its sixth annual spring concert.

The theme of this year's concert which begins its tour April 24 at Elmira College is joy.

Despite the problems and pain present in everyone's life and in our world today, the chorale believes that it is also a valid Christian message to express the joys which exist.

As always, the program will be divided between fine classical numbers such as Brahms' "How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place" and Mascagni's "Anthem for Spring" and more familiar selections such as songs from "Fiddler on the Roof" and folk music.

The concert will be presented in the Southern Tier, Rochester and Geneva.

A special benefit performance has been added to the Rochester schedule this year, a Sunday matinee in Honeoye Falls, the entire proceeds from which will be used for Camp Haccomo, the summer recreational program sponsored by the area Rotary clubs.

The sisters will perform at Ithaca College and at DeSales High School, Geneva on April 25. They will spend three days, April 30-May 2, at St. Agnes High School, Rochester, and will conclude their program at Honeoye Falls-Lima Central High on May 16.
