The Melkite Exarch, Archbishop Joseph Tawil, will be the guest of Rochester's Byzantine Rite Catholics at two separate functions, Saturday and Sunday, May 8 and 9, at St. Nicholas Church.

The archbishop will be guest of honor with Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey at a social hour and dinner, Saturday, at 7:30 p.m. in St. Nicholas Church basement.

According to Father Athanasie Hassey, pastor of the 20-family congregation, the archbishop also will celebrate the liturgy at 11 a.m. the following Sunday.

Father Hassey, pastor for the past 3½ years at the Byzantine Rite church, revealed that the archbishop this month inaugurated a new magazine for Melkite Catholics in the U.S. entitled *Sophia*. The slick-paper photo magazine serves as a news magazine and journal of opinion.

The congregation at St. Nicholas follows the liturgical forms developed by St. John Chrysostom, and has attracted many Roman Catholics, Father Hassey said.

The archbishop has served as the director of the Patriarchal College in Egypt and was named to the vicar Patriarchate in Damascus, before coming to the United States.
