Cabrini Circle Plans Dinner

The Mother Cabrini Circle, which helps black students pay their way through Catholic high schools in Rochester, will hold its annual scholarship fundraiser Sunday afternoon, May 16, at Montgomery Neighborhood Center, 10 Cady St.

The smorgasbord dinner will be a 25th anniversary celebration for the circle, which was founded by one of Rochester's outstanding black citizens, the late Mrs. Harriet Schuyler.

Dinner will be served from 1 until 5:30 p.m., at \$2.50 for adults, \$1.25 for children. In the library there will be a display and sale of Mexican craft work arranged by Daniel and Margaret Whalen, who work among the poor of Mexico in winter. A portion of the profits will go to the scholarship fund.

Bexley Gets New Dean

The Rev. Hays H. Rockwell, now University of Rochester Protestant chaplain, will become dean of Bexley Hall, the Episcopal member of the Rochester Center for Theological Studies.

On Sept. 1, he will succeed the Rt. Rev. Daniel Corrigan, who became interim Dean in 1969 and will now return to his home in Denver, Colo.

"The decision to leave the university was not an easy one." the Rev. Mr. Rockwell said. "I enjoyed doing the job and felt I had really just begun."

"But the work at Bexley Hall seemed risky enough and interesting enough to try to undertake it. The institution is clearly committed to moving

down the road. Very few institutions are willing to lay down everything and go. Colgate Rochester / Bexley Hall / Crozer seems to be on the verge of that."

The Rev. Mr. Rockwell will be Bexley Hall's chief representative at various functions, will work in the areas of recruitment and cultivation of the Bexley Hall constituency, and will serve as an advisor to Episcopalian faculty and students.

Bexley Hall affiliated with Colgate Rochester Divinity School in 1968. The two schools, together with Crozer Theological Seminary and Roman Catholic St. Bernard's Seminary, now make up the Rochester Center for Theological Studies.
